# Tips for Maintaining Water Quality & Safe Recreation on Bear Lake: Share these Clean Water Guidelines with visitors & renters

- Clean lake vegetation from boats, trailers & props before entering or leaving the lake to stop the spread of invasive aquatic species
- · Respect recreational boating hours:
  - o High Speed Boating Permitted Only from 11 a.m. to 7:30 p.m.
- Always wear a lifejacket during water activities
- Please do not bathe or wash any animals or vehicles in the lake
- Pick up trash you see in the lake or along the shore
- Support & participate in Bear Lake Association septic system testing
- Be aware of loons while boating and leave a safe distance
- State Law requires boat traffic to move in a counter clockwise direction
- No beach fires below the high water mark
- No fireworks on public property, boat launch or township road ends, etc.
- Fireworks are legal on private property ONLY: the day before, the day of and the day after the three National Summer Holidays Memorial Day, Fourth of July and Labor Day
