Share these Clean Water Guidelines with visitors & renters

- Clean lake vegetation from boats, trailers & props before entering or leaving the lake to stop the spread of invasive aquatic species and do not dump bait into the lake
- Respect recreational boating hours:
 - o High Speed Boating Permitted Only from 11 a.m. to 7:30 p.m.
- Use phosphorous free fertilizers and do not allow grass clippings into the lake.
- Please do not bathe or wash any animals in the lake and pick up their droppings.
- Rake the shoreline in the spring and fall to remove leaves, sticks and debris.
- Rake swim areas.
- Pick up floating plants and trash you see in the lake or along the shore.
- Support & participate in Bear Lake Association septic system testing.
- Be aware of loons while boating and maintain a safe distance.
- State Law requires boat traffic to move in a counter clockwise direction.
- No beach fires below the high-water mark.
- No fireworks on public property, boat launch or township road ends.
- DO NOT feed the geese/ducks. They are carriers of a parasite linked to swimmers itch.
