Tips for Maintaining Water Quality & Safe Recreation on Bear Lake: Share these Clean Water Guidelines with visitors and renters

- Clean lake vegetation from boats, trailers and props before entering or leaving the lake to stop the spread of invasive aquatic species. Clean, Drain, Dry stopaquatichitchhikers.org
- Respect recreational boating hours:
 - o High Speed Boating Permitted Only from 11 a.m. to 7:30 p.m.
- State Law requires boat traffic to move in a counterclockwise direction.
- Use phosphorous free fertilizers and do not allow grass clippings into the lake.
- Please do not bathe or wash any animals in the lake and pick up animal droppings.
- Keep shorelines natural:
 - o Native roots prevent erosion please leave them at the shoreline
 - o Fallen trees in the lake provide excellent fish, turtle and frog habitat
- Rake the shoreline in the spring and fall to remove leaves, sticks and debris.
- Pick up floating plants and trash you see in the lake or along the shore.
- No beach fires below the high-water mark.
- No fireworks on public property, boat launch or township road ends.
- DO NOT feed the geese/ducks. They are carriers linked to swimmer's itch. Install a string fence on your shoreline when away.
- Be aware of loons while boating and maintain a safe distance.

Tips for Maintaining Water Quality & Safe Recreation on Cub Lake: Please share these Clean Water Guidelines with visitors & renters

- Water Skiing and High-Speed Boating is prohibited on Cub Lake!
- State Law requires boat traffic to move in a counterclockwise direction.
- Natural shorelines are best for Cub Lake
 - Native roots prevent erosion please leave them at the shoreline
 - o Fallen trees in the lake provide excellent fish, turtle and frog habitat
- Clean lake vegetation from boats, trailers, and props before entering or leaving the lake to stop the spread of invasive aquatic species. Do not dump bait into the lake.
- Limit fertilizers Only use phosphorous-free. No grass clippings in the lake.
- Do not bathe yourself or animals in the lake. Please pick up animal droppings.
- Rake the shoreline in the spring and fall to remove leaves, sticks and debris.
- Pick up trash you see in the lake or along the shore.
- No beach fires below the high-water mark.
- No fireworks on public property, boat launch or township road ends.
- Be aware of loons while boating and maintain a safe distance.
- Support and participate in Cub Lake septic system testing.
- DO NOT feed the geese or ducks. They are carriers linked to swimmer's itch.
 - Install a string fence on your shoreline to deter water foul on the property.
